Sermon: I Love My Church - Communion

The Importance of Reminders

- The Old Testament is filled with them
 - Abraham built stone altars
 - The Israelite nation followed this example during the wilderness wandering and conquest period
 - Jewish feasts were instituted to remind the Jews of key points in their history
 - Perhaps none is more central to the Jewish faith than Passover
 - Christians also have a “feast” that serves as a reminder
 - It's no accident that it was born out of the Passover Seder
 - Luke 22:14-20
- I. A Feast of Memorial
- A. The Four Cups of Passover
1. Cup One – Exodus 6:6a – “I am the Lord and I will bring you out of the burdens of the Egyptians”
 2. Cup Two – Exodus 6:6b – “I will deliver you from slavery”
 3. Cup Three – Exodus 6:6c – “I will redeem you with a an outstretched arm and with great acts of judgment”

4. Cup Four – Exodus 6:7 – “I will take you to be my people, and I will be your God, and you shall know that I am the Lord your God who has brought you out from under the burdens of Egypt.”

B. The Cup of Jesus

1. Jesus claims to be the fulfillment of the promises of Exodus 6 for a new covenant
2. Jesus would also assume the role of the Passover Lamb, so when God sees the blood of Jesus, He passes over us
3. Communion is a memorial to the blood sacrifice of Jesus that paved the way for a new and better covenant

II. A Feast of Promise – John 14:1-4

A. Wedding betrothals in the Ancient Jewish world

B. A marriage is a covenant between two parties

1. Both parties pledge faithfulness to each other
2. The imagery of husband and wife is often used in both Old and New Testaments to describe God’s relationship to His people

C. The promises of communion

1. Faithfulness
2. A place is being prepared for us (and we are being prepared for a place)
3. The groom will return for His bride

III. A Feast of Proclamation – I Corinthians 11:23-29

A. Communion, like baptism, proclaims the death, burial, and resurrection of Jesus

B. We are proclaiming our association with Jesus by symbolically making Him a part of us

1. Just as Husband and Wife are one in marriage, so is Jesus and the Church
2. In a real way, communion is a weekly vow renewal

C. If we are to proclaim the death of Jesus, we must make sure we examine ourselves first

1. Are we loving our neighbor well?
2. Are we striving towards faithfulness?
3. Are we seeking forgiveness for anything that may taint our proclamation of the Gospel?
