- I. What Won't Be in Heaven Revelation 21:1-7; 22-27
  - A. No Sea
    - 1. In the ancient world the sea was a symbol of death and destruction
    - 2. The sea is also a great divide, like death, that separated loved ones from one another
    - 3. There will be diversity without division
  - B. No Death, tears or pain
    - 1. The Bible personifies death as an enemy to be defeated
    - 2. Death is not natural, when Heaven comes, there will be a great restoration
    - 3. This also means, no disease, no funerals, no hospitals, no nursing homes, and no goodbyes

- C. No Church Buildings!
  - 1. Heaven will be a place of worship and gathering
  - 2. We will always be in God's presence

  - 2. The Church exists to prepare us for such a place

    - 2. That will be free of sickness
  - D. The Tree of Life Revelation 22:1-2
    - 1. We come full circle, back to where it began
